THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT B

THE SEASON OF LENT is a 40-day season of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends at sundown on Holy Thursday. It's a period of preparation to celebrate the Lord's Resurrection at Easter. During Lent, we seek the Lord in prayer by reading Sacred Scripture; we serve by giving alms; and we practice self-control through fasting. We are called not only to abstain from luxuries during Lent, but to a true inner conversion of heart as we seek to follow Christ's will more faithfully. We recall the waters of baptism in which we were also baptized into Christ's death, died to sin and evil, and began new life in Christ. In Lent, the baptized are called to renew their baptismal commitment as others prepare to be baptized through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, a period of learning and discernment for individuals who have declared their desire to become Catholics at the Easter Vigil.

LENT STATIONS OF THE CROSS The Stations of the Cross will be prayed each Wednesday at Saint Patrick's at 11.15am and on Thursdays at St Mary's at 11.20pm (except when a funeral is scheduled) This will begin on Wednesday 28th and Thursday 29th February. If you would like to help lead the stations, please sign the list in Church.

LENT LECTIO DIVINA "divine reading." Lectio Divina is a method for praying with the Scriptures. As we read and invite the Word to become a transforming lens that brings the events of daily living into focus, we can come to live more deeply and find the presence of God more readily in the events of each day. The method of lectio divina follows four steps: lectio (reading), meditatio (meditation), contemplatio (contemplation), and oratio (prayer). During Lent we have the opportunity to experience 'Lectio' at St Mary's at 1pm on three Wednesdays, 21st February, 6th March and 20th March at St Mary's Parish Office after 12.10pm mass. Do come along and join us and experience this lovely form of prayer.

ST MARY'S PRESBYTERY We have for some time been trying to let St Mary's Presbytery to Ukrainian refugees. Unfortunately, even though we have been in touch with charities that house refugees, we have been unsuccessful, and we are now starting to look for a commercial tenant instead. The large size of the house makes it unsuitable for most refugee families unless they use it as a house of multiple occupation, but sadly this would require significant building modification and licensing by the local authority. Also, the lack of parking is putting off tenants too. Some parishioners have kindly donated furnishings and furniture yet the Diocese has told us to let the Presbytery empty. Please get in touch with Teresa (telephone number above) if you would like to take back your items by Thursday 29th Feb. We know that this is a disappointing outcome, but the parish costs of the upkeep of having the presbytery unoccupied is increasing, and the Diocese has recommended this course of action.

CONFIRMATION CANDIDATES Thank you to those who have asked to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation. As we move towards our formal preparation sessions, we look forward to seeing our candidates at Mass each week as they prepare to begin their formation. Naturally, it is important that our candidates **are practicing** the faith in order to receive the sacrament.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION 2024 We ask all candidates to participate in Mass each Sunday and to ensure their participation register is signed each week by the priest or a catechist. Participation in Mass is the most important aspect of a child's preparation for the sacraments. We would expect children to attend a minimum of two thirds of Sunday masses as part of this preparation, taking into account illness and holidays. Let us ensure that our children come to know the presence of the Lord in the Mass.

LITURGIES OF RECONCILIATION Bishop Declan will celebrate a liturgy of Reconciliation on Wed 21st Feb at St Anthony's Melksham at 7pm. There will be priests available to celebrate sacramental reconciliation.

February – The Month of the Holy Family



February is dedicated to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Jospeh. On 2nd Feb we see the Holy Family go to the Temple for the Presentation of Jesus. The family is together. The Holy Family. This month-dedication traces back to the 17th century. But how much do we remember or hear that today? This February we should restore that devotion. It would both honour the Holy Family and at the same time becomes a reminder to strengthen family life. After all, the Church has taught how the Holy Family is the model, the example, for all families. So said St John Paul II in a 2001 Angelus address, as he called "the family of Nazareth a model for every home." These are perfect reasons to start honoring the Holy Family this month. "The Holy Family is the beginning of countless other holy families," John Paul II said earlier in his *Letter to Families*. He stressed, "The history of mankind, the history of salvation, passes by way of the family." In fact, the saintly pope made it plain that he was trying "to show how the family is placed at the center of the great struggle between good and evil, between life and death, between love and all that is opposed to love."

THE FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT (B)



First reading

A reading from the book of Genesis

Genesis 9:8-15

God spoke to Noah and his sons, 'See, I establish my Covenant with you, and with your descendants after you; also with every living creature to be found with you, birds, cattle and every wild beast with you: everything that came out of the ark, everything that lives on the earth. I establish my Covenant with you: no thing of flesh shall be swept away again by the waters of the flood. There shall be no flood to destroy the earth again.'
